UNIFORM

We require all pupils to attend school dressed smartly in school uniform in order to ensure high standards in all aspects of school life, including a positive work ethic and conduct in and around school. We thank parents in advance for supporting our school uniform expectations.

Cwmbran High will continually monitor the quality of pupils' uniform and encourage pupils to develop a sense of pride in themselves. First impressions do count and by continually reinforcing our high standards of uniform and appearance we aim to prepare our pupils for the world of work.

As families, purchasing uniform and ensuring your child arrives to school dressed appropriately can be very stressful. Our uniform guide is designed to support families with this, by detailing our expectations with regard to uniform. This will help all families prepare for the new term in September.

We aim to ensure that all of our pupils look smart and feel part of our school community, but not at the undue expense of families. While the school has a strong partnership with Pretty Miss in Cwmbran, it is important for families to know that only official school uniform needs to be purchased from Pretty Miss. We have ensured as a school that the cost of our uniform is affordable yet of the highest quality. All official items (school tie and logo badge) are only available from Pretty Miss. However, all other items can either be purchased from our supplier, other clothing stores or supermarkets. Please do not think that every item has to be purchased from one supplier.

We hope our uniform guide provides both pupils and families with clarity around our uniform expectations.

We do have the highest expectations of our pupils and throughout the academic year, pupils should expect to be challenged by staff where they fail to meet our expectations with regard to school uniform. This applies particularly to footwear, where pupils can expect to be asked to wear 'shoes' provided by school in the event of arriving in unacceptable footwear.

MAIN SCHOOL UNIFORM

All pupils in Years 7 – 11 are expected to wear school uniform as outlined below. It is important to note that a compulsory black blazer will be phased in at the start of the 2023/24 academic year, starting with pupils in Year 7. The expectation for uniform is:

- White Shirt (please ensure the collar is large enough as the top button will be done up at all times)
- School Tie
- Black Cotton V-neck Jumper / cardigan * (No hoodies/ sweatshirts)
- Black Blazer - These are available from various retailers. Blazers with the school badge are available from Pretty Miss. School badges are also available from Pretty Miss should parents/carers wish to sew onto a plain blazer.
- Black tailored trousers (not tight or skinny fit- no leggings or jeans) / black tailored shorts or Black knee length skirt
- Black or grey socks/tights
- Plain black shoes - (trainers are not permitted)
- Plain coat/jacket (no large logos or patterns, no sleeveless coats or any type of hoodies will be allowed)
- No jewellery apart from one stud in each ear, one flat ring and a watch
- No facial piercing or tunnel / spike earrings (Pupils will be asked to remove and the item confiscated)
- No extreme hair colour or styles (Natural colours only) - pupils will be instructed to wash out extreme colours when they return home and tie hair up if possible for the remainder of the day. Tramlines or patterns in hair are not permitted.
- No obvious make-up or nail varnish

* Item is not compulsory

PE Uniform

Boys

- Plain black T shirt – Round neck
- Plain black shorts
- Black rugby socks
- Studded football / rugby boots and suitable trainers (*no daps are allowed*)

Optional items:

- Reversible rugby top
- Black and purple polo top/round neck
- Black and purple shorts
- School rugby socks
- Quarter Zip black top
- Black base-layer top ('skin')

Girls

- Plain black T shirt – Round neck
- Plain black shorts
- White socks
- Suitable trainers / training shoes (*no daps are allowed*)

Optional items:

- Black and purple polo top / round neck
- Black and purple shorts / skirt
- Quarter zip black top
- Black base-layer top ('skin')
- Plain black leggings

Labelling clothing

With over 1100 pupils in our school it is important that families label the uniform of children. Uniform will occasionally become misplaced so having a label clearly identifying the name of the pupil will help reduce the risk of loss.

Coats

We encourage pupils to wear a coat to school, when required. However, coats should not have any large logos on them. Coats must not be worn inside the school building.

Blazer

The blazer is a symbol of our school identity. Pupils are expected to wear their school blazers every day to and from school. They should also wear the blazer inside the school buildings, unless given permission by a member of staff to remove it.

Trousers

Denim, corduroy, chino, tapered, skinny-jean style or skin-tight style trousers are not permitted. Students are expected to wear black trousers which sit smartly at the waist and on the ankle/shoe line.

Skirts

There is no official school skirt. However, any skirt worn to school must be black and the length of the skirt should be appropriate for a school and/or workplace environment.

Footwear

We expect our pupils to wear leather or leather-type shoes with a low heel.

Black trainers including popular designs such as Converse, Nike, Vans etc or boots are unacceptable.

Please see below examples of footwear that are not acceptable:



'High top' leather or canvas trainers. For example, Converse (or equivalent)



Laced leather or canvas skate trainers. For example, Vans (or equivalent)



Laced leather trainers, with branding. For example, Nike (or equivalent)



Laced canvas trainers, with or without branding. For example, Adidas (or equivalent)



Dr Martins (or equivalent) boots



Velcro trainers with or without branding. For example, Lacoste (or equivalent)

If your child has a medical condition that requires a reasonable adjustment to the above, please contact your child's head of year.

Footwear on the 3G Pitch

To protect the playing surface and ensure player safety, only approved footwear may be worn on the 3G pitch. Details of permitted and prohibited footwear for use on the 3G pitch are shown below:

PERMITTED FOOTWEAR:

	Artificial Ground (AG) RECOMMENDED Specifically designed for extra abrasion, these boots usually feature more numerous and densely concentrated studs that vary in height and may be hollowed out.		Firm Ground (FG) RECOMMENDED Sole plates feature moulded studs which are evenly dispersed across the foot to offer enhanced traction and comfort.
	Hard Ground (HG) RECOMMENDED Sole plates utilise a harder Thermoplastic polyurethanes compound for enhanced durability and typically feature multiple slightly shorter, evenly dispersed studs for optimal pressure distribution.		Turf Trainer (TF) ONLY WHEN DRY Otherwise known as Astro's, they feature a solid rubber outsole with numerous, small multidirectional lugs spread across the sole, which offer limited grip in wet conditions.

FORBIDDEN FOOTWEAR:

	Soft Ground (SG) TEAR THE SURFACE Sole features removable, replaceable screw-in studs and typically come in a six-stud configuration, with four at the forefoot and two at the heel.		Soft Ground Pro (SGP) TEAR THE SURFACE Also known as Hybrid or Mixed Stud, the sole plate comprises of a combination of conical screw-in studs and moulded studs, which are most commonly bladed.
	Blades CAN CAUSE INJURY Sole plates feature multiple straight slightly shorter, evenly dispersed studs that can restrict movement and turning which could cause injury.		Flat Sole (Indoor) NO GRIP & FLATTEN SURFACE Sole made up of non-marking materials such as moulded gum rubber and feature pivot points, flex grooves and herringbone patterns.

Make-up and nails

We do not encourage students to wear make-up or nail varnish to school. However, if make-up is worn, it must be subtle and discrete.

Jewellery

Any necklace must be worn underneath the shirt and easily removed for PE lessons (for health and safety reasons). Pupils may wear a plain metal stud only. All other piercings are not acceptable. All jewellery must be removed for PE lessons.

Hair

Hair should be natural in colour. Hats and baseball caps should not be worn inside the school building. They should only be worn to keep the head warm during the winter or to protect from the sun in the summer.

Religious head coverings

A number of world faiths wear head coverings as a symbol of their identity. The school does not specify a particular colour of head covering (for pupils who are required to wear one for religious reasons) as the style may vary dependent on cultural differences.

Mobile phones

Mobile phones are not permitted to be used during the school day. We accept however, that pupils may wish to bring their mobile phone with them to use on their way to and from school. "Gate to Gate" Please be aware that the mobile phone remains the responsibility of the pupil and the school cannot be held liable for any loss, breakage or theft. If your child has a mobile phone in use it will be confiscated and returned to a parent/carer, in person, at the end of the day.

The Headteacher's decision regarding uniform is final.
